Wyandotte Board of Education

No Child Left Behind Act – School Attendance Options

The Board of Education acknowledges that the Federal “No Child Left Behind Act of 2001” (NCLBA) provides that the parents/guardians of students enrolled in a Title I school that has been listed for “School Improvement” for two (2) or more years, have the right to transfer their children to another school in the District (according to current Federal regulations at the time), provided there is a school that provides instruction at the student’s grade level and such school has not been identified as being in the process of school improvement, corrective action, or restructuring. If there is not a qualifying school in the District, the Superintendent shall contact neighboring districts and request that they permit Wyandotte students to transfer to a school in one of those districts if the parent/guardian requests a transfer. The Superintendent shall also offer Supplemental Education Services (SES) if a transfer within the District is not possible.

Students attending a “persistently dangerous” school, as defined by the Revised School Code (MCL 1311(1)) have the right to transfer to another “safe” school in the District (according to current Federal regulations at the time). If there is not another “safe” school in the District providing instruction at the student’s grade level, the Superintendent shall contact neighboring districts and request that they permit Wyandotte students to transfer to a school in one of those districts if the parent/guardian requests a transfer.

Furthermore, a student who is a victim of a “violent crime” on school property, (as defined by the Revised School Code, constituting a felony violation of MCL 750.81 to 750.90g; or that constitutes an assault and infliction of serious or aggravated injury under MCL 750.81a), also has the right to transfer to another school (according to current Federal regulations at the time). If there is not another school in the District providing instruction at the student’s grade level, the Superintendent shall contact neighboring districts and request that they permit Wyandotte students to transfer to a school in one of those districts providing instruction at the student’s grade level if the parent/guardian requests a transfer.

The Board of Education authorizes such transfers in accordance with AG 5113.02.

Students who transfer within the District, in accordance with this policy, will be permitted to remain at the school of transfer until completing the highest grade at the school.
