**All students should report <u>ON TIME to all rehearsals and events!</u>

(Remember "To be early is to be on time, to be on time is to be late, and to be late is to be left behind!")

*** "PRE-CAMP" and "BAND CAMP" are <u>required</u> components for membership in the marching band.

For the greatest growth and success of the Wyandotte Marching Chiefs, ALL students are required to attend summer rehearsals, fundraisers, and camps. In the exception that a student is out of town, advanced communication is necessary in written form. 





REQUIRED PAPERWORK

BAND CAMP

BAND CAMP is required for all members of the Wyandotte Marching Chiefs. *By attending Band Camp you are making a commitment to the Marching Chiefs for the entire season.* Band Camp is where the Marching Band learns its fall season pre-game and half-time show, the personality of the band is created, life long relationships are created, and our personal and group goals and objectives are established. During Band Camp, individual growth, musicality, as well as fun are guaranteed!!

DATES: Sunday, August 18- through Saturday, August 24

Parents will check students in Sunday at 10:00am at RHS. Luggage is collected **Friday night, Aug 16** during the Tag Day/ Car Wash fundraiser. Band camp will end Saturday, August 24th. The WMC 2019 Premiere Performance will be held at RHS upon our return (around 4:30pm). This will be a great opportunity for friends and family to support the band and see all of their hard work come together in performance.

WHERE: Colombiere Conference and Retreat Center in Clarkston, MI

Our students will enjoy the beautiful facilities at the Colombiere Center located in Clarkston, MI. For more information see <u>http://www.colombiere.com/</u>. Transportation to/from band camp will be provided. No student vehicles will be permitted at camp. To ensure the safety and productivity of our students while at band camp it is our policy to run a **CLOSED CAMPUS CAMP**. There will be <u>no visitors</u> allowed on campus without the advanced permission from the camp director, or in the case of an emergency situation. Students are not permitted to leave the camp at any time during the week.

PRE-CAMP: Rehearsals, Uniforms & Band Camp Departure Meeting

In order to have a productive Band Camp and superior Marching Band season, several dates have been included in August for rehearsals, final uniform fittings, Band Pictures, and the mandatory Band Camp Departure meeting. August pre-camp rehearsals are REQUIRED and are all listed on the music department calendar at <u>http://charmsoffice.com</u> calendar. The Mandatory Band Camp Departure Meeting will be held on Thursday, <u>August 13th</u> to answer remaining questions about Band Camp and the fall season, as well as introduce the 2019 Marching Band Staff.

BAND CAMP FEE: \$450.00 – Total Due by August 13th

This fee covers costs associated with your student's participation in August Band Camp, and it finances bus transportation and season expenses. The initial deposit of \$150 is necessary in order to reserve your student's spot at Band Camp and is non-refundable. Students and families are encouraged to participate in all our scheduled fundraisers in order to assist with the fees that accompany membership in the Marching Chiefs.

Additional fees may include equipment fees, marching shoes, black socks, and gloves for band—see fee schedule detailed below. You may check with your student's current school music teacher or the Music Booster Treasurer, Cindy Duda at (734) 284-8122 for individual account balances. No student will be allowed to attend camp or participate in the Wyandotte Marching Chiefs without having this payment made in full prior to camp (The music boosters will also add a 15% fee for all LATE PAYMENTS)

FUNDRAISING

The key to any successful fundraiser is participation. Every marching band member will be responsible for participating in our fundraisers in order to raise necessary funds to stay active in the marching band. There are two different types of fundraisers—group and individual. Group fundraiser profits go to the WMC. Individual fundraiser profits go into a student's account to be used toward individual expenses. All band members are expected to participate in group fundraising events, and encouraged to participate in individual fundraisers.

GROUP FUNDRAISING

Wyandotte Street Art Fair Parking Lot July 10-13th—PARENTS ONLY Sign up for a time to work our assigned lot. This is a profitable fundraiser, and an easy one as there are many open time slots. Sign up, work a shift, and then go to the Art Fair, or go walk around first, then come work a shift! (See Mr. Cartwright for Details)

WMC TAG DAYS and Car Wash July 19th & *August 16th*—TAG DAY is a Chiefs tradition, and a regular part of our annual community donation drive. *All band members are required to participate*. Students will stand outside local businesses and ask for donations, giving a 'tag' to those that donate. On that same day, students, with parent supervision, staff the Car Wash and each section usually signs up for a designated time to wash cars together. Both fundraisers are FUN and profitable; the community knows to expect these fundraisers and most people are very generous to our members.

INDIVIDIDUAL FUNDRAISING

Wyandotte Art Fair clean up committee—Sign up for shifts to walk around the art fair and sweep and empty trash receptacles. Every shift a student, parent or other family member works for that student will credit their individual account. Many people are needed for end of the night shifts to clean up after the art fair closes—the "graveyard shift" is a great way to get the whole family involved and earn for the individual account. (See Mrs. Kane for details)

Wyandotte Car Wash Coupon Pre-sales—Pre-sell individual car wash coupons for \$5.00; all presale coupon profits will benefit the individual student account.

If you are interested in helping with any of our summer fundraisers, you can sign up for your shifts on Charms or contact the Instrumental Music Office. Various other fundraisers are held throughout the season and school year; stay tuned for information about upcoming fundraising events.

WYANDOTTE MUSIC BOOSTERS

Every parent of a Marching Chief is automatically a member of the Booster club. Meetings are held on the second *Tuesday of the Month in a RHS music classroom. Attendance at meetings is encouraged as a way to stay informed about upcoming events.

VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITY

Looking for a way to get involved, give back, make a difference, be part of your high school student's band experience, or just meet some other parents and have some fun? There are PLENTY of opportunities for every parent to participate to help the WMC during the season. Whatever your particular talent or skillset is, the band needs you! We need people to tailor uniforms, pull the trailer to competitions, load and unload props, design and build props, get the pit instruments on and off the field, work at events such as Downriver Fanfare, hand out uniforms before and after games, act as bus chaperones, donate and serve food on competition Saturdays, and many other jobs large and small.

2019 FALL REHEARSAL SCHEDULE AND ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES

*<u>PLEASE NOTE:</u> MARCHING BAND IS A GRADED CLASS AT RHS BASED ON PERFORMANCE AND INDIVUDAL GROWTH IN MARCHING BAND.

BAND CAMP & SUMMER REHEARSALS: Participation in Band Camp and Summer rehearsals are a requirement for membership in the Marching Band Class. All students will receive a grade average following Summer Rehearsals (August) and Band Camp Rehearsals. This will be the first grade received upon the start of the 2019 academic school year.

REHEARSAL ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES:

- All rehearsals are *MANDATORY* (including most sectionals)
- Attendance is taken by the Band Secretary at the start of each rehearsal
- ➤ 3 unexcused tardies = possible suspension from next performance
- > 1 unexcused absence = possible suspension from next performance

EXCUSED ABSENCE/ TARDY:

MARCHING BAND - Excused absence request form; <u>Google Forms - WMC Absence</u> <u>Request</u> or a written note from parent 24 hr. in advance (unless emergency), including date, name of student, reason for missing rehearsal;

----in the event of an emergency absence, PLEASE CALL THE INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC OFFICE AND LEAVE A MESSAGE!!!! (759-5236)

Absence from any marching band activity will only be excused under the following circumstances:

- 1. Death in the family (must be accompanied by parent note)
- 2. PRE-arranged school activity (**minimum of two weeks notice**)
- 3. Doctor's excused absence (must be accompanied by parent note)

*If you have an injury that prohibits you from marching, you are still expected to attend and participate in all rehearsals and performances from the sideline.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCE/ TARDY:

Including any absence or tardy not communicated to the Band Director with 24 hours advance notice, in addition to the following:

- 1. Forgot rehearsal or performance / including time or location
- 2. Did not secure a ride to practice
- 3. Homework
- 4. Work conflict

2019WMC GRADING POLICY

Do I receive a grade for this?

Marching Band IS a CLASS at Roosevelt High School. Even though WMC meets after regular school hours and on weekends, students will receive class credit and a grade that will appear on report cards and college transcripts. Therefore, ATTENDANCE, rehearsal attitude, and performance IS ALWAYS IMPORTANT.

The following grading system is modeled after other policies that have fairly evaluated a musician's progress in a school music ensemble setting. This policy has proved successful, and the quality of bands it has produced has been exceptional!

30 pts. Per Week for Rehearsal Preparation/ Participation 25 pts. Each playing test / Assignments 100 pts. Each Performance

Rehearsal points can be gained or lost by the ABC's of Marching Band: "Attitude, Behavior, and Conduct"

Total points possible divided by total points earned = grade

*Please note Wilson Middle School (8th grade) band members will not receive a grade or credit for participation in Marching Band.

What is a Phys Ed. Waiver?

Because of the physical demand involved in participation in marching band rehearsals and performances, the Wyandotte Public Schools will award active and passing members ¹/₂ of the 1 required Phys. Ed. Credit (you will still need to take one semester of Health & Wellness to meet the State requirement necessary for graduation, provided you complete 3 full years of marching band, as described below.)

- You must complete the entire season of marching band and receive a passing grade.
- Marching band requires a great deal of physical stamina and flexibility. The beginning of each rehearsal is dedicated to stretching and flexibility exercises. It is essential that students take good care of themselves outside of marching band rehearsals to help avoid injury, sickness, and fatigue.

BAND REHEARSAL & STUDENT EXPECTATIONS!

In order for us to have the most positive environment in which to learn and develop into our fullest potential as an ensemble, the following rules must be followed:

1) Have a Positive Attitude

- 2) Be Early!
- 3) Give every effort in rehearsal
- 4) Come prepared***
- 5) Keep rehearsal focus
- 6) **Respect** all members of the staff as well as fellow band members
- 7) Have a positive attitude

<u>NECESSARY SUPPLIES/ EQUIPMENT</u> Students are expected to bring the following to every rehearsal

Instrument/ Flag/ Sticks

The Wyandotte Public Schools have a limited number of "marching instruments" for rental.

Colorguard / Percussion will need to fill out an equipment usage contract for the Marching season but will NOT be charged a usage.

Music/ Marching Drill

-Every member should have a "DRILL BOOK" that can easily hang around their neck.

(Coordinate sheets will be provided to each student once, at band camp)

-Every member should have a music folder or "FLIP FOLDER" & "MUSIC LYRE"

(Music will be provided only once, and it is the responsibility of the student to maintain their own copies.) **Music Binder**

All band members will be responsible for keeping all music and informative handouts together in a 3 ring binder. Plastic sheet protectors are encouraged for keeping music safe.

<u>Flip-Folder</u>

Small folio sized "Flip-Folders" are available from all local music stores. Students are expected to keep all pep-band and parade music in these folders, and have it labeled with their name on it.

Water Bottle

Required for ALL Rehearsals throughout the summer (including band camp)

Athletic/ Tennis Shoes

Marching requires good, supportive shoes. <u>NO SANDALS, FLIP FLOPS, ETC</u> (Regardless of your section of the band)

Large brim hat/ Baseball Cap

Hot weather can lead to exhaustion, especially while at band camp. – WE NEED YOU ON THE FIELD, NOT ON THE SIDELINES!

Reeds, Mouthpiece, Case, Valve Oil, Cork Grease, etc.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As a member of the "Wyandotte Marching Chiefs" students are expected to act in accordance with the behavior rules for all students at RHS. The Roosevelt High School Code of Conduct will be enforced throughout the season rehearsals, and performances. Every member is reminded that they are a representative of our band <u>on and off the field</u> and therefore must act accordingly. **Every member of the staff, every volunteer, and every counselor in attendance will enforce these rules.**

Bullying and Hazing:

The Wyandotte Marching Chiefs support the Wyandotte Public Schools **policy against Hazing and Bullying. Hazing and Bullying of any kind will not be tolerated (including Cyber Bullying).** Furthermore, negative comments and posts (on any social networking site) regarding the Wyandotte Marching Chiefs and/or persons involved with the Music Department will be treated as such.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

The Marching Band Member Will:

-Have a positive attitude

-Be on time and at <u>all</u> rehearsals, performances, and band activities.

-Respect the other members of the band.

-Respect the band equipment and maintain the RHS band uniform.

-Maintain moral and proper behavior.

-Never have possession and/or use of alcohol, tobacco products and illegal drugs.

-Listen to, and respect all staff, and parent volunteers.

-Absolutely no use of profanity, sexual conduct, physical violence, or hazing.

Uniform Conduct:

The Marching Band Members will:

-Wear appropriate shoes for performance/ rehearsals

<u>Rehearsal</u> = comfortable sneakers & socks. NO Sandals, or tight jeans!

<u>Performance</u> = Black Shoes, black socks.

-Always stay in groups of two or more.

-Wear complete uniform or half uniform when in public.

-ALWAYS FOLLOW THE CODE OF CONDUCT!

-ABSOLUTELY NO PDA (Public Display of Affection)

-Be responsible for lost or damaged uniform parts.

-Be responsible for maintaining uniform between performances

Stand Etiquette:

The Marching Band Members will:

-Maintain a professional attitude while performing in the football stands.

-Refrain from playing their instrument or the instruments of others unless directed.

-Stay within the designated seating arrangement for stand performance.

-Respect the authority of the Marching Band staff, parent volunteers, and chaperones.

-Only during the third quarter will band members be permitted to leave our designated seating area to visit friends or family in the stands.

***Violation of these rules will result in disciplinary action, suspension from activity/ and referral to school administration and quite possibly <u>immediate</u> removal from the Marching Band which will also result in Class Failure.

2019 CAMP COUNSELORS

2019 Camp Counselors will consist of 5 male and 5 female adults that have been selected by RHS Band Director. Interested parents should contact the band director for information. Selected counselors are preferred to have had experience with the Marching Chiefs program or have been involved in specific counselor training prior to band camp.

Camp counselors are our dedicated 'mommies and daddies' away from Wyandotte. Students are to treat them all with respect.

Band Camp housing assignments will be made by the director and will be permanent and at the sole discretion of the Marching Band Director.

*We operate a camp that abides by the Camp Licensing procedures provided by the State of Michigan, and the above counselors and staff are dedicated to observing, protecting, and mentoring the health and well being of all students while at band camp.

VOLUNTEERS

It takes many volunteers to help the marching band be successful each season. All volunteers need to complete the volunteer paperwork with the Wyandotte Public Schools prior to volunteering for any event. At the very minimum parent involvement in the Wyandotte Music Booster meetings each month is beneficial to the continued growth of our department.

RULES FOR BAND CAMP

While at camp, students are expected to act in accordance with the behavior rules for all students at RHS. The Roosevelt High School Code of Conduct will be enforced throughout the week of camp. Every member of the staff, every volunteer, and every counselor in attendance will enforce these rules.

Violation of these rules may result in immediate expulsion from camp. **CODE OF CONDUCT:**

-Eat at all regular meals

-Stay out of other cabins you are not assigned to

Dress Code:

-Appropriate shoes and socks worn at all rehearsals

-Shoes must be worn at all times

-Appropriate clothing cover the body from shoulder to mid-thigh.

-No clothing that exposes undergarments of any kind

-No bathing suits

-No "short" shorts, or low riding pants.

-Hat with brim must be worn at all times on the marching field.

Rooming Assignments:

All room assignments are permanent for the entire week. Students are not permitted to move to another room unless it is the decision of the Director. Students should not enter a room that is not assigned to them.
